

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.)

One of a few 18th century houses in Brookline, this structure, originally a simple farm-house, was extensively remodelled in 19**76.** Before that date, beaming in the hall and cellar and the old staircase with very wide board treads were visible and indicated 18th century construction.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.)

The John Harris House was built on property which belonged to Robert Harris in 1655. According to Nina Fletcher Little, the house was probably built by John Harris before 1788. Harris was a farmer as well as a deputy sheriff.

At one time, the property was owned by Mary and Edward Brandegee whose large mansion still overlooks the house. At the time of Brandegee ownership, the John Harris House was a caretaker's cottage and the entire estate was called Faulkner Farm, named for the Faulkner family who owned land in this area in the early part of the 19th century.

Today the house is part of Allandale farm, the only working farm left in Brookline. The farm's acreage encompasses land in both Brookline and Boston; until 1968, the land was still privately farmed, but after that date it became a commercial enterprise. Although the farmhouse and one of the barns have been dramatically altered, there are still a number of outbuildings, including another barn and numerous sheds(#6 on map) as well as a tenant's cottage which remain relatively untouched. Some of the facilities of the property are used by a private nursery school during the academic year. (#3 on map) In addition, part of the acreage crosses over into Boston, MA. There is a greenhouse just over Because the house and outbuildings are set so far back from Newton Street and are the Boston li approached by a narrow dirt road, the rural atmosphere of this 18th century farm has, in large part, been retained.

The John Harris House and farm meet NR criteria A, representing the last working farm of the town whose first economy was based on agricultural activity.








