Built in 1851 for Ginery Twitchell, a celebrated local jique who was successively a post rider, railroad president and member of the United States House of Representatives. Irom this house, he could look down the hill at the station for "his" railway, the Boston and Worsester line. Even without so illustrious an owner, the house is a lovely and unusual illustration of 19th-century Stationate architecture. Ginery Twithell died there in 1883, after occupying it for thirty two years.
